The project will be coordinated between the FoNR, Rodney Parade Ltd and the Stadium Developer and further details will be available from FoNR soon. Details of pricing will be firmed up in the near future, as will ordering arrangements.

We're Watching...

Newport RFC asked if FoNR could assist with raising the standards of ability to analyse games particularly post match. A FoNR donation has secured the services of Owen Griffiths (pictured) as the new analyst who video's and codes the games, clipping the good, bad and the ugly clips together to allow the players to observe. He also provides individual/unit comparative stats and can provide analysis support on opposition.

Mike Sage commented, "He is certainly an asset to Newport RFC. His analysis is slick and very effective and he certainly benefits the club. Having a professional analyst on board will allow the coaches to go into greater depth with team and player analysis."

Owen told the FONR, "As an integral part of the 'Principality' Welsh Premiership, Newport RFC are at the forefront of, as a semi-professional club, developing a professional attitude and approach to the way that we conduct ourselves in training and on match day.

As top flight sport is consistently evolving and developing, the provision of feedback for teams and athletes via computerised analysis has become paramount to success. Performance analysis has been described by many as 'one of the key elements in the structure of the coaching process' and that feedback attained using the analytical tools now available through developments in technology has improved and augmented a coach's ability to critique performance, through the generation of specific statistics and information that is desired about performance.

For the past few seasons, with the aid of the WRU, Newport RFC have been able to tap into this resource and gain some of the main forms of feedback available in rugby union with footage of games being provided with vital statistics in terms of team and player performance. However, this season, with the help of the Friends of Newport Rugby Trust, we have been able to take our analysis procedures one step further and enlist the support of an analyst to come in on Tues-days pre-training, and with the aid of the coaches, put together a review of the weekend's game, highlighting both positive and negative critical instances from it for feedback, as well as then on a Thursday, providing a preview of the opposition to be faced the following weekend, to bring to the players attention opposition strengths and weaknesses, as well as their key plays/players.



With these enhancements to feedback, players and coaches can take key work-ons from the weekend's games, as well as set team and individual targets for further player development, and the future progression of New-port RFC as a top contender in the Welsh Premiership."


